My involvement was researching and sourcing products and design specification (NBS), obtaining quotes and ensuring compliance and suitability. I incorporated these into the drawing pack and was responsible for the technical detail and construction drawings for later issuing. I ensured strict compliance with the listed building conditions and access requirements.

I conducted measured surveys of the existing structures on site translating the information into the as-existing general arrangement drawings. These formed the basis for the final proposed drawings pack. I was responsible for several schedules of work including conservation and repairs as well as assisting on the BREEAM assessment. As Purcell were the Project Managers I collated and audited the tender information from the sub-consultants ensuring accuracy ahead of tender issue. During the tender period I responded to queries and gained first hand experience of a large project at this critical stage.

I gained extensive experience in building regulations, complying with the design & access statement, fire strategy and preparing and submitting a secured by design application. As the project was in its construction phase, I dealt with numerous contractor queries, and provided construction detail drawings and specifications.

I prepared information for the competition bid, including site analysis diagrams outlining site positives and opportunities and early concept design proposals. Following the competition win, I worked on the brief development and further detailed concept designs later liaising with the heritage consultant from the local authority and preparing proposals to the client.

I have had experience of working on successful bid proposals, brief preparation, planning application and listed building consent, early stage conceptual design work, site analysis, 3D modelling and report writing/curating. I have worked closely with project leads whilst also working independently, understanding the importance of accuracy and clarity. I am confident in liaising with clients and the importance of understanding their needs whilst managing expectations, and have developed strong communication skills and team working ability.
